**Directions: From the West** on Highway 152 turn North (left) on San Juan Road to Hutchins. Turn East (right) on Hutchins to Elgin and follow the directions below to the park

**From the East** on Highway 152 turn North (right) on Palm to Hutchins. Turn West (left) on Hutchins to Elgin and follow the directions below to the park.

Turn North on Elgin until the end of the paved road. At the end of the paved road there will be white gateposts leading to the east (right). Follow that road east between the alfalfa fields and along the river 0.7 miles to the white gateposts on the north (left) side of the road. Turn in at the white gateposts to the park site.
