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## Let's Talk Powdery Mildew 2003 Experimental Plot

**WHAT:** Field Meeting  
**WHERE:** Avenue 13 at Cottonwood Creek  
**WHEN:** Thursday, July 10, 2003  
9:00 - 11:30 a.m.

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Come by the plot (see map and directions) anytime between 9:00 - 11:30 a.m. for about one hour of talking about and looking at the results of the 2003 powdery mildew plot. As always the pressure in this plot has been heavy and good differences are observable.

This year we have tested new modes of action, softer chemistry and, of course, continued looking at resistance management.

**Directions:** North of Madera - 99 south - take Firebaugh/Kerman Hwy. 145 exit. At freeway exit go left 40 yards and turn right on Madera Avenue. Go south one mile to Avenue 13. Turn left (East) 2 3/4 miles to plot. Look for University of California signs along the road.

South of Madera (a) take 99 North to Avenue 12. Turn right (East) approximately 40 yards to Road 29 (it is the first possible left on top of the overpass without going back onto the freeway). Turn left (North) go one mile to Avenue 13. Turn right, go approximately 3/4 mile to plot.

(b) Kerman/Biola area - 145 North toward Madera to Avenue 13. Turn right (East) 2 3/4 miles.

**If you get to Cottonwood Creek you just missed the plot.**
